About the Ryan Shuman Foundation and Golf Tournament:

Ryan Shuman was a senior athlete from Eden Prairie who lost his battle on December 1, 2006 (just 11 days shy of his 18th birthday) after a 29 month fight against a rare childhood cancer called Rhabdomyosarcoma.

During Ryan's 29 months fight, he became a strong advocate for the fight against childhood cancer and it was his goal to help raise awareness, improve the quality of life for children with cancer, and most important, find a cure.

Ryan represented one of 350,000 children diagnoses with cancer each year under the age of 20. He also represents the 20% of these children that can't be cured! We need to find a cure now before another parent has to hear the words "your child has cancer"!
